From the Staff at River's Edge

We experienced unprecedented communication with parents and caregivers, and this was not anything we planned! New friendships were established between mentors and mentees and between the youths who found themselves at the farm with their fellow mentees each week. The support that River's Edge receives comes in many forms and from many sources. Market! We are so grateful to them for this gift and honour. We will have the pleasure of hosting the grade 3 students later in December when we will meet and spend time with our young benefactors. Before the Christmas break, we will also have the pleasure of hosting the grade 1 students from DCS in connection with their study on animals. They will visit the farm to learn about the animals that live at River's Edge and how they are used in our programs.

We have recently noticed a need for community and fellowship amongst the mothers with young children in our greater community. While our focus is one-on-one mentoring, we have provided time in our schedule for a couple of hours, every other Wednesday morning, for mom's with their young children to spend time at the farm! For our Winter block, we will host a community drop-in for

Moms & Tots (children aged 0-5 years). The intention is to provide a Christian environment where moms can socialize, support, and encourage one another. Staff will NOT be providing any kind of programming or activities but they can make a good cup of coffee or tea. Please see elsewhere in this newsletter for more information."

Thanks so much!We are incredibly thankful for all of our volunteers and supporters at River's Edge. God's presence is evident here, and He has blessed us in many ways. Youths who come to River's Edge spend time with compassionate, caring, Christian adults who are committed to sharing the love and hope of Christ. There is a significant demand for one-on-one mentoring, and our waitlist has ballooned. The majority of the youths on our waitlist are boys aged 10 years

and older, and it is essential for them to be paired with male mentors. We are thankful for the men and women who have responded to God's call to volunteer and support the work at River's Edge. Our Spring 2025 mentoring block begins the week of March 31st. Please prayerfully consider if you can spare an hour and a half, once a week, to share with a youth. Thank you for your continued support, encouragement, and prayers.
